

"Our warehouses are full of sacks of coffee from Vietnam, Brazil, Colombia and many other countries".





WESTERN EUROPE - MAJOR GREEN COFFEE IMPORTERS

- Besides the YOY growth we see already today the huge importance of **South-America as our trade** partner
- Antwerp is a main Coffee hub in Northern Europe with 400k mt pa. Coffee remains a cornerstone for the port
- +35% of our coffee comes from Brazil
- Flow of goods from a central hub is key to secure growth
- With warehouse around the port, we secure **container flow**
- As from the warehouses we transport by sustainable transport the goods to the consumers




